Fast Facts

- Riverview employs 191 certificated staff and 183 support staff. Sixty-eight percent (68%) of the certificated staff have Masters Degrees.
- In 2008, 80% of graduating seniors advanced to college, either two or four year, with \$1,250,000 collegiate scholarships awarded.
- Advance Placement pass rates were at 74% when combining all AP classes taught compared to 57.6% for the state.
- Honoring an approach which focuses on the "whole child," Riverview School District is committed to the four "A's" with outstanding Academic, Athletic, Activity and Arts programs.
- District-wide WASL improvement is among the best in the Puget Sound Region.
- Riverview Schools have received both state and national awards.

RIVERVIEW SCHOOL DISTRICT COMMUNITY AND SCHOOLS OVERVIEW

COMMUNITY

The Riverview School District is located 30 miles east of Seattle in the beautiful lower Snoqualmie Valley, serving the communities of Carnation, Duvall, and surrounding areas of eastern King County. The Snoqualmie River winds through the district, with the forested foothills of the Cascade Mountains creating a scenic natural backdrop for the valley.

The area's quiet charm and friendly ways, combined with easy access to the urban amenities of Seattle, Bellevue, and other nearby cities, make it one of the most desirable places to live in the Puget Sound Metropolitan Region. Ample opportunities for hiking, camping, skiing, canoeing, and kayaking add to the area's appeal.

The partnership between the community and the school district is well established. Community recreational events, youth sports, adult education, fine arts, and other groups utilize the facilities on a daily basis. The community has consistently shown full support of the school district and recently passed a four-year operations levy, a four-year technology levy, and a \$56,600,000 capital facilities bond.

Riverview Educational Foundation (REF) is a non-profit, volunteer organization established to generate financial and community support to enrich the educational opportunities for Riverview students. The foundation oversees equitable distribution of financial donations through its Grants and Award Programs. Each year grants are awarded to district staff for the purpose of improving student learning through enrichment activities such as curriculum enhancement and the promotion of health and wellness.

SCHOOLS

The Riverview School District covers 250 square miles in eastern King County, and serves more than 3,100 students in three elementary schools, one middle school, one high school, and three alternative programs.

Carnation Elementary aspires to build a community of life-long learners in a child-centered atmosphere. With its warm, caring staff, small size and child-centered atmosphere, their goal is to work together to meet the needs of every child.

Stillwater Elementary is a dynamic learning community where all students thrive. Stillwater encourages a sense of belonging, a desire for excellence, and the resiliency to adapt to a changing world.

Cherry Valley Elementary is a warm, welcoming, and child-focused school where students and staff are valued and respected. There is always a place for families and the broader community to invest time, energy, and talents on behalf of all Cherry Valley children.

Tolt Middle School looks for the talents within all learners while setting high expectations and academic standards. Students and teachers at Tolt are organized in teams and grade-level groups to create an environment that gives a sense of community within the context of the larger school.

Cedarcrest High School promotes the opportunity for all students to acquire the essential social, cultural, and academic skills necessary for success in the 21st century. Cedarcrest has been recognized consistently throughout the years for outstanding student success in Advance Placement Exams, Washington Assessment of Student Learning, and college entrance assessments. The high school operates on a modified six-period day, and offers college preparatory classes, college-in-the-high-school opportunities, career and technical education, as well as special services for students with disabilities. Cedarcrest boasts a graduation rate of 98%.

ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS

Eagle Rock Multi-Age Program provides another choice in grades K-5 for 75 students. This program integrates curricular areas through school-wide thematic units to bring learning alive for students. Teachers use a variety of teaching techniques to meet students' individual learning style. Eagle Rock depends on shared commitment and required volunteer time from each family.

PARADE (Parents And Riverview Actively Delivering Education) Program, working in tandem with families educating their children at home, supports students grades K-12 to become passionate life-long learners and caring, respectful citizens. A menu of courses is designed and offered with valued input from participating families.

CLIP (Contracted Learning for Individual Pacing) provides an educational opportunity for students in grades 10-12 who are seeking an alternative way to earn a high school diploma.

Note: Both PARADE and CLIP offer a Riverview high school graduation diploma for students completing the requirements.
